On February 10, 2013, the Company Executive Council met. With the death of Governor Dan McGuire, the nominating committee recommended Lt. Governor, Jacquelynne Schulman be elected Governor. Rachel Wills, who had been serving as Registrar, was elected Lt. Governor, Nancy Hill was elected Registrar, and Kathryn Zabriskie was elected to fill the vacant

Counselor seat.

In Memorandum

Charles Danny McGuire passed away Saturday January 19, 2013 at his home in Reston, Virginia. Born in Washington, DC on June 28, 1938, he was graduated from the University of Maryland, College Park, where he played baseball. Throughout his life remained an avid supporter of the Terrapins and a member of the M Club, and served as president of the Terrapin Club in Virginia.

He proudly served in the United States Army rising to the rank of Brigadier General, served in the Army Reserves, and held various positions in the federal government. He and his wife Edie, son Shannon and daughter Kirsty lived in Reston where he was a community leader and served as President of the Reston Homeowner's Coalition. He nominated Reston for the National Civic League's All-America City Award.

He served as a board member and vice president of the Reston Citizens Association (RCA) and was a strong advocate for self-governance, supporting RCA's pushes to get Reston incorporated as a town or an independent city.

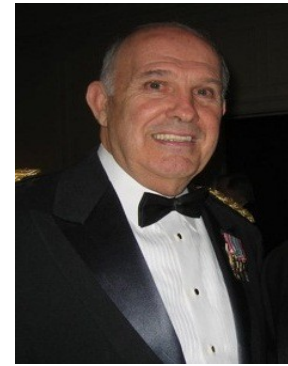
He was a joiner and belonged to an impressive list of local and state organizations including the Knights of Columbus, American Legion, the Virginia Historical Society, the Lincoln Club, the Republican Club of Greater Reston, and the Northern Virginia Republican Business Forum.

He was a member and leader of many other lineage societies, including First Families of Virginia, Sons of the American Revolution, the General Society of 1812, Society of the Cincinnati, and many others.

In 1999 he was installed as President of the Virginia Jamestowne Society. In 2007 he served in leadership roles planning the 400th anniversary celebration of the founding of Jamestowne.

He was elected Governor of the Washington and Northern Virginia Company in 2011, and resigned from that position a week before his death. In his memory, the Company has made a contribution of \$1,000 to the Jamestowne Society.

Dan McGuire was outspoken in his opinions, known for his good humor and easygoing nature. He provided invaluable experience, high moral ethics, guidance, and friendship to the members of the Society. He will be sorely missed.

Jamestowne Bell Tower

The only remaining 17th century edifice at Historic Jamestown is the approximately 40-foot masonry church bell tower. While its exact construction date is uncertain, it is thought to have been built in the mid-1600s. The bell tower is in critical need of repairs and maintenance to avoid collapse, and the Society has established a dedicated capital fund for this purpose.

The Washington and Northern Virginia Company has started a challenge grant. The Company has made a \$1,000 donation, and will make \$1,000 donations for each \$9,000 raised, up to a total of \$5,000.

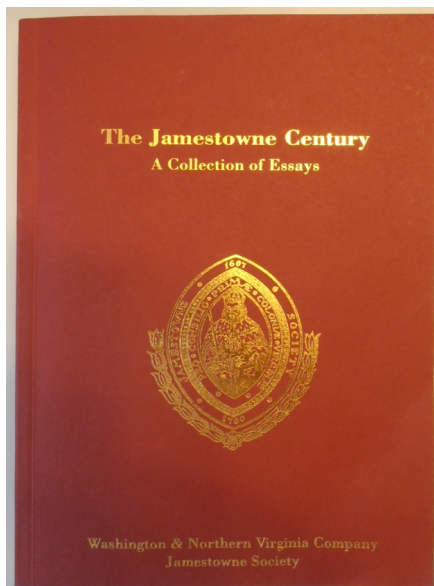
